Best Ever Corn Chowder

1/4 Cup butter-melted

1/2 Cup onions-diced

1 Cup celery-diced

2 ½ Cups hot water (Joyce used chicken broth)

2 Cups potatoes-peeled & cubed

3 Cups frozen corn

1 Tbsp granulated sugar-optional

2 tsp salt

1 tsp cracked pepper

3 Tbsp flour

2 Cups Half & Half

6 slices bacon-cooked and crumbled

- Cook onions and celery in butter until soft.
 Add next 6 ingredients
- Cover and simmer until potatoes are softabout 30 minutes
- Heat until it gets nice and thick, smushing some of the potatoes against the side of the pan, and stirring often
- Stir in bacon and serve- yields 4 servings
- Enjoy!
